LETTER FROM OUR FOUNDER

Dear Friends,

What a year this has been! First and foremost, I hope you and your loved ones are well.

Like elsewhere around the world, COVID hit Malawi hard.

Thankfully, as I write this in April 2021, there has been a steep drop in cases, hospitalizations and deaths. There is increased optimism as vaccines have arrived, though like elsewhere, uptake remains a challenge in certain areas.

Our three key programs are going strong despite the pandemic. Mzuzu International Academy (MIA), like all private and public schools, was closed by government order at various points over the past year, most recently in February 2021. School re-opened on February 22nd. Fortunately, we've had no COVID cases since the re-opening. Enrollment remains strong, with 350 students from kindergarten through high school. Maloto supports 31 vulnerable students with scholarships.

Kwithu CBO was honored – again – by the Egmont Trust, a UK-based foundation. The Egmont Trust has been supporting Kwithu CBO for over eight years. The actual award – The Most Inspirational Individual or Group - was given to the Vwira Women, who are volunteers that help to implement Kwithu's various community-based projects. The Vwira Women were essential in helping the community respond to the COVID-19 pandemic.

Kwithu Kitchen (KK) launched a honey product line in April 2020 to compliment our tomato line. In less than a year, KK has become Malawi's largest honey processor and distributor. Despite the challenging times, the KK team set a record for their highest monthly sales ever in February, topping \$ 28,000 - which translates to almost four tons of honey sold!"

Your support during these still challenging times means the world to me and has allowed Maloto's impact to remain strong, as we feed, educate and empower the next generation of Malawians.


