

What a year it has been! Thanks to your unwavering support, Maloto continues to transform lives in Malawi, proving that distance is no barrier to meaningful impact. Through our programs that **feed**, **educate**, and **empower**, we are building brighter futures for thousands of vulnerable women and children.

Here are just a few of the milestones you helped make possible in 2024:



#### Kwithu Women's Group: A Celebration of 20 Years

This past October, 14 of our U.S.-based board members and donors traveled to Malawi to commemorate Kwithu Women's Group's 20th Anniversary. The celebration was not just a milestone—it was a testament to the dedication and resilience of the women of Kwithu. The Mzuzu community warmly welcomed our U.S. supporters, recognizing their steadfast commitment to our transformative work.

#### Kwithu Kitchen: Breaking Records & Expanding Impact

- October was a record-breaking month: over 7 tons of honey sold, generating \$45,000 in sales!
- Over a decade ago, Kwithu Women started canning tomatoes in a classroom originally meant for after-school tutoring. This year, we secured a dedicated facility that will be renovated in 2025—finally providing a proper food processing space while returning the classroom to its intended purpose: educating children.

#### Mzuzu International Academy: Excellence in Education

- Our Senior class delivered outstanding results in last year's IGCSE exams.
- With a 10% increase in enrollment, our student body now approaches 450, reinforcing MIA's reputation as a premier institution for academic excellence.

#### A Presidential Visit to Kwithu Kitchen

We were honored to welcome Malawi's President, His Excellency Lazarus Chakwera, to Kwithu Kitchen this past March. His visit underscores the significance of our work and the growing impact of Kwithu's social enterprises.

#### **FEED**

- •850+ children participate in after-school tutoring and feeding
- •16 adults in precarious environments provided with supplemental meals three times per week

#### EDUCATE

- •446 students at Mzuzu International Academy (MIA), reflecting a 10% increase in enrollment
- •44 scholarships to gifted Kwithu CBO children to attend MIA
- •240 students have graduated from MIA since our first graduation in 2015
- •300 scholarships for vulnerable children from the Kwithu Women's **Group** to local government schools
- •23 Maloto scholarship students have now graduated from college, including 8 from our original group of 20 children
- •15 scholarships awarded to MIA graduates to attend university
- •60 3-5 year-olds in Early Childhood Education classes
- •53 participants graduated from our new Vocational Skills Training Program in four trades: carpentry, food production, tailoring, and bricklaying
- 16 vocational scholarships awarded to students in teacher training and other vocational skills programs

#### **EMPOWER**

- •Kwithu Kitchen remains Malawi's largest honey processor & supplier. In 2024, sales increased by 40% compared to 2023!
- •Kwithu Kitchen successfully completed a 3-year, \$250,000 grant from the Government of Flanders and Norwegian Church Aid to expand beekeeping in 2 remote areas, training over 600 beekeepers and distributing 1,700 beehives, 200 bee suites & 200 bee smokers. This initiative is a model of sustainability, as KK will continue to purchase honey from the project's beekeepers even beyond the grant period.
- •Kwithu Women's Group Revolving Fund provided \$12,000 in loan capital for 270 loans distributed to 120 women. With a 100% repayment rate, these loans support 5 different women's groups, strengthening entrepreneurship and economic opportunities while fostering financial responsibility.

Each program is registered locally and has its own senior leadership team and governance structure. Maloto works with each partner to increase and diversify their funding through fees and income generating activities, sales, and also by securing grants from a wide range of foundations and other donors.

Over time, Maloto's support will represent a smaller proportion of overall funding, demonstrating that Maloto's support has a significant multiplier effect.
